

This book is truly written for kids to learn. There is no element of religion and political ideology. It is purely knowledge based book of American History and Literature with smack of world cultures and science. What a relief from the nonsense being shafted down our kids' throat at the public school.

I love this series of books and, being a teacher in the state of Washington, this is about the only resource out there that is easy to use and directly linked to the standards and available by a specific grade level for OUR test. Other curricula claim to be linked to the standards, but then when you get them, that's actually not the case. This has each EALR spelled out and gives you questions for each one. The only problems are that you have to buy the answer key separately from the "workbook" which means that all the information on what the answers are and how to solve them is in another book. This also includes the alignment to the standards and how many of each question go with each standard. Finally, the BIGGEST problem is you can't copy any of it-it says so in great big letters at the bottom of each page. I really try to adhere to copyright guidelines, but there just isn't anything else out there like this; believe me I'd look. I wish this publisher would give us teachers a break and release a book for classroom use!

I got this for my daughter who doesn't like to read non-fiction. The stories are short and the questions are multiple choice. She finds the stories interesting. It has great vocab words and hits several areas - main idea, inference, etc. Plan on showing it to her teacher this fall.

This is a great comprehension set of pages. It's roughly 1 page of a story and then comprehension questions. This is great practice to prepare students for End of the Year testing. The stories are interesting. (One passage is how basketball was made)...Con (as a teacher) They don't ask enough questions. I just started adding my own "hunt for the answer" questions on spot where another question could have fit...

Great information that my daughter enjoys learning about. Incorporates vocabulary within each lesson, enhances reading comprehension skills and holds interest for kids who typically don't like social studies...We use this for home schooling, in addition to a regular textbook.
