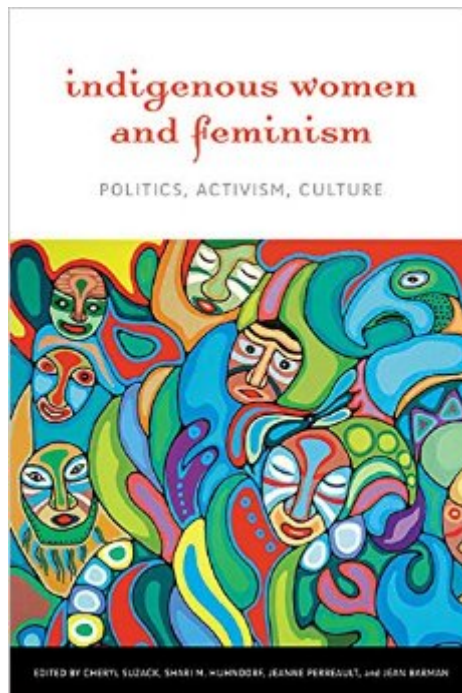


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Indigenous Women And Feminism: Politics, Activism, Culture (Women And Indigenous Studies Series)
