

I thoroughly enjoyed reading this book, which I imagine will have broad appeal, not just for folks interested in aviation, but also who are interested in adventure, or even those who are

contemplating a career in the world of private jets, or even those who are interesting in getting a very different glimpse of a unique viewpoint of Asia (itself a very interesting part of the world), but from 45,000 feet and specifically about how VVIP's travel so efficiently. Although some passages from what happens in the air was fascinating, what is perhaps even more captivating is the author's description of what happens on the ground, at private jet terminals, and in his interaction with business and government leaders and their entourage. Once I started reading this book, I couldn't stop reading haha. The author writes with integrity about his experiences in being a private jet captain but also brings humor to the book. His passion for his chosen career really comes out, as does his commitment to safety and service and to mentoring those around him. I think people from the commercial airlines world may be surprised how much more personal business aviation is, how broad the responsibilities of a private jet captain really are, and how much difference they can make in helping VIP's, who no doubt rely on these captain's to reach remote places where numerous investments are made and jobs created.
